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


WageKey Analysis Reports & Maps

Selecting Data for Wage Analysis Report & Map:

Project data are reported by survey date range (construction site visit date range), county, job classification, wage rate, and any other appropriate selection criteria.


In the illustration below, only data reportable on the federal D.O.L. WD-10 survey (following "peak week" rule) are included, and all project data are selected for the period of 04/01/2010 through 03/31/2011 for all Minnesota counties, including highway, heavy, building & residential construction data. (Data are not real.)



Generating Wage Analysis Report & Map:

On the screen illustrated on the prior page, the user clicks the "PRINT" button to generate the "Wage Analysis Report", and the "MAP" button to generate the "Wage Analysis Map". These output reports both include all the selection details in the report header area, and these reports go hand-in-hand.

After clicking the "MAP" button, the software also generates a number of map and legend graphics and a grid object (illustrated below) which can be quickly popped into a PowerPoint.






Federal WD-10 Submission Process for ND Illustrated **Federal WD-10 Submission**

Selecting Data for WD-10 Survey Submissions:

Project data are selected by survey date range (construction site visit date range), county, job classification, wage rate, and any other appropriate selection criteria.

In the illustration below, all project data are selected for the period of 10/01/2010 through 03/31/2012 and MERCER County, and then the 2 preferred wage rates are selected for federal submission for MERCER County. This step is repeated for each county. This feature automatically adheres to all federal WD-10 reporting guidelines, including the "peak week" rule.



Opening Electronic WD-10 Survey:

On the screen illustrated on the prior page, the user typically previews and prints completed paper or PDF reports before clicking the "WEB" button to begin the final WD-10 submission.


After clicking the "WEB" button, the federal electronic WD-10 web form is opened and the screen illustrated below appears while the electronic WD-10 web form is loaded, evaluated for changes, and while the initial WD-10 survey form is populated with accurate survey data.



Reviewing Electronic WD-10 Survey:

The screen illustrated below displays after each WD-10 survey is properly prepared and populated with accurate data.


The user may scroll down to spot check data before clicking the "CONFIRM & SUBMIT" button at the top of the screen.



Sample Electronic WD-10 Survey Data:

Scrolling down within the WD-10 survey reveals a complete report without error. The automated software populates the survey with data which have already been thoroughly validated – adhering to all federal reporting rules. When the user clicks the "CONFIRM & SUBMIT" button, the software quickly evaluates the survey data once more to ensure that all data are valid, consistent, and to make sure that no data have been altered manually by the user prior to clicking "CONFIRM & SUBMIT".


The Classification and Fringe Benefit section of the WD-10 survey is illustrated below.



Record of All Submitted WD-10 Surveys:


The automated software automatically captures and records the CONFIRMATION ID which is generated by the federal D.O.L. WD-10 web service, and all survey batches (for each submission session) are recorded separately and permanently for ongoing review and analysis. In addition, the federal D.O.L. WD-10 web service triggers a confirmation email which is instantly sent to the provided email address after each individual federal D.O.L. WD-10 survey is "CONFIRMED & SUBMITTED" by the user.

In the illustration below, 11 survey batches are recorded and made permanently available for future reference and analysis. These 11 survey batches below happen to represent 11 counties, 88 WD-10 surveys, and 388 workers.



One Example of WD-10 Survey Analysis:

The automated software includes numerous analytical reports and exports. The basic map and legend below were produced with a few easy mouse clicks.
